Highly skilled experts



- Highly skilled professionals move abroad for career reasons
 - Voluntary mobility
 - Relatively well-off
 - Often temporary stays
 - North-north or south-north
- Expatriate: "a person who lives outside their native country"

- International schools in Finland
- Fieldwork with 9-year-olds 2019-2020 (9 months)
- Fieldwork with 14-year-olds 2021-2022 (8 months)
- participant observation
- children's interviews
- drawings, photos & film
- Digital cameras to children and teenagers
- Film "Hanging Out"





Fieldwork

Negotiating the role: adult among children & teens

- Assistant teacher or not a teacher? Friend? Adult?
- The least adult role (Mandell 1988)
- Playing and joking
- •Failures: English skills, online worlds, cleaning up
 - in art class, bad jokes
- Improvisation & vulnerability
- Gaining trust in time



Drawing projects



- difficult to conduct in a school setting where teachers follow strict curriculums
- would require long-term planning



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Photo projects

life beyond school "important things in your life"







- 9-year-olds excited but not many photos
- •14-year-olds not very interested
- •I got visual material but not new knowledge











Film: Partipatory joint project vs reality

- •Ethics with the film:
 - the participants had the right to forbid me to show the film to anyone
- The film turned out to be very different from what I had planned
 - Ethnography is flexible
