**9.30 Talk by Johannes Wagner** Where are we now? From disembodied talk to the full ecology of interaction

In this introduction to the workshop, I will go through the history of our field and argue that the development of analytic understandings, methods and tools for data-representation has been driven by the expansion into new types of data.
