 - North-north or south-north

Fieldwork

International schools in Finland

- •Fieldwork with 9-year-olds 2019-2020 (9 months)
- •Fieldwork with 14-year-olds 2021-2022 (8 months)
 - participant observation
 - children's interviews
 - drawings, photos & film

 Gaining the "natives" point of view Giving them voice, making them visible





Drawing projects

- difficult to conduct in a school setting where teachers follow strict curriculums
- would require long-term planning
- Not everyone likes to draw
- Challenging to chat with everyone in
 - the classroom
- Random themes









Photo projects

life beyond school "important things in your life"







- 9-year-olds excited but not many photos
- •14-year-olds not very interested
- •I got visual material but not new knowledge
 - Material realities & locations & hobbies












Film: Hanging Out 19.47

- •Who volunteers and why?
- •Ethics with the film:

the participants had the right to forbid me to show the film to anyone

- The film turned out to be very different from what I had planned
 - Lack of after-school gatherings
 - Themes: friendships, researcher role
- Giving voice and making visible
 - But need a narrative too
 - A reflexive story







What was made visible? What remained invisible?

- Who participates in research activities and who does not?
 - Success stories visible
 - Considering research ethics (invisibility)
- Everyday realities and relationships visible
- Transnational backgrounds less visible
 - Perhaps not so significant?
- •Is the film my story?
- Celebrating long-term fieldwork
